## **Undergraduate Student Transfers**

There were 43 eligible undergraduate students enrolled in the fall 2022 semester who did not re-enroll in the fall 2023 semester. Based on student self-report and/or university personnel knowledge, six (6) undergraduate students (14%) transferred to another institution of higher education.

# **Undergraduate Student Employment Upon Graduation**

Each year, undergraduate students completing their programs are asked to complete an exit survey about their employment status. For undergraduates who earned their bachelor's degrees during the 2023-24 academic year, 84% reported being employed. Of those employed, 88% reported being employed in their field or related field of study. In addition, 79% reported that they plan to continue their education.

### **Graduate Student Employment Upon Graduation**

Each year graduate students completing their programs are asked to complete an exit survey about their university experiences, perceptions, and current status. The response rate for graduate students completing the survey during the 2023-24 academic year was 88%. For graduate students who earned their master's degrees during the 2023-2024 academic year, 71% reported being employed. Of those employed, 100% reported being employed in their field or related field of study. Of the unemployed students, 50% indicated they were not currently seeking employment. In addition, 57% reported they plan to continue their education.
