## First-Time, Full-Time Degree-Seeking Undergraduate Retention Rate

# First-Time, Full-Time Degree-Seeking Undergraduate Graduation Rate

The most recent six-year graduation rate information for first-time, full-time degree-seeking undergraduates who began in the fall semester of 2018 is 0%

It is noted that Martin University enrolled too few students (i.e., less than 20 students) in the fall semester of 2018 to report with confidence graduation rates by gender, by major ethnic/racial subgroups, by recipients of a Federal Pell Grant, by recipients of Federal Direct Loan, or by recipients who did not receive a Federal Pell Grant or a Federal Direct Loan.

## **Undergraduate Student Employment Upon Graduation**

Each year, undergraduate students completing their programs are asked to complete an exit survey about their employment status. For undergraduates who earned their bachelor's degrees during the 2023-24 academic year, 84% reported being employed. Of those employed, 88% reported being employed in their field or related field of study. In addition, 79% reported that they plan to continue their education.
